About the Scott County Humane Society

The Scott County Humane Society is united in a mission to ensure humane care and conditions for companion animals through spay/neuter, humane awareness education, and responsible pet adoption and ownership. Since 1981, our volunteer-run organization has provided lifesaving programs to cats and dogs, and outreach services to those in our community. We work to save and better lives through successful cat and dog foster and adoption programs, a pet food bank, spay and neuter programs (including a trap, neuter and release (TNR) program for stray cats), and our Adoption and Education Center in Georgetown. In 2019, 247 stray cats and 327 publicly owned cats and dogs were spayed or neutered through our voucher program. A total of 295 dogs and 718 cats were adopted through our foster program and we provided over 1800 meals to needy animals through our Pet Food Bank.
